Sustainability at Informa

Sustainability is increasingly important to event attendees – Around 80% of the typical event participants tell us so. We also know it's increasingly important to our exhibitors like you, who are looking to protect and enhance your brand.

Exhibiting at National Restaurant Association Show gives you the opportunity to highlight your company's sustainability credentials and align with an event that champions sustainability and protects your reputation.

Better Booths

The Better Booths programme aims to celebrate exhibitors, along with their appointed contractors, who choose to build reusable booths instead of single-use disposable ones.

- A disposable booth is a space only/raw space booth that is used only once and typically constructed from raw materials onsite and then send to landfill or burnt for energy after the event.
- A reusable exhibition booth is any booth that is used more than once and can include systems using wood, aluminium, fabric, cardboard, glass, plastic and other materials.

We are actively piloting and developing this programme with other event organisers across the industry and greatly appreciate your involvement and support. More information on the programme can be found at betterbooths.info.

What's in it for me?

- A better quality, more attractive and safer booth
- Lower stress design and build
- Opportunity to promote the sustainable credentials of your brand
- Smoother, more efficient build up and breakdown periods
- Fewer building hours and more predictable timings
- Reduce costs including waste bills

What do I need to do?

To make your commitment to Better Booths and contribute to a more sustainable event:

- 1. Familiarise yourself with the Better Booths framework found below
- 2. Share these guidelines with your contractor before they begin designing your booth
- 3. We encourage everyone to work towards a Silver level <u>OR</u> ensure your booth meets a Bronze <u>level</u>. This <u>means that</u> the booth structure and walls, platform or raised flooring, furniture, equipment and lighting are all reused. Doing this usually eliminates most of the waste and takes a big step towards reusability without compromising on cost or booth design.
- 4. Ensure that the submitted booth design clearly communicates how you will meet the Better Booths guidelines

- Ask for information from you or your contractor during the floorplan design submissions so you can make us aware of the reusability of your booth. Submission required for island and peninsula booths only.
- Provide an option of a turnkey solution that is Better Booths compatible: Refer to Freeman's service kit, the Show's General Contractor.
